6. New business

- a. Outdoor Learning Spaces
 - Media released that all schools will receive \$25,000 for outdoor learning space. Our education centre has 4 different designs to choose from and a summary of the cost/budget. We need to decide what we want for our space.
 - ii. Option 1: Outdoor learning circle to encourage people to gather, learn about cultural significance, circle concept in Mi'kmaq culture, chalkboard facing the south if possible (\$25k)
 - iii. Option 2: Smaller learning space, few benches, to "reflect", small group setting, Mi'kmaq and African flags and directional aspects
 - iv. Option 3: Amphitheatre (\$38k) we have no natural hills, need to ensure accessibility for mobility, cost more to build up to make the hill
 - v. Option 4: Raised garden beds materials already here to make three garden beds with the kids, rain barrel for downspout so we already have the supplies to make this happen ourselves
 - vi. Really up to option 1 or 2 more leaning toward first option, discussion around distraction of road traffic if putting it out front (which seems to make the most sense space-wise, aesthetically and to avoid septic and electricity running underground)
 - vii. Decision needed by December 10
 - viii. Katie to ask whether some changes can be made, do we strictly need to use materials in the classroom area or elsewhere on the property? Maybe purchase fruit trees instead of shade trees
 - ix. Can put in an order up to \$25,000
 - x. Motion to go with option #1.1 Classroom circle by Terri-Lynn, seconded by Jessica L, **approved**
